FMCSA REGULATIONS/ HOURS OF SERVICE	Over the past 9 years there has been an unprecedented number of regulations that have been promulgated by the federal government. Many of these newly finalized and pro- posed rules have come from the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT), particularly from the DOT agency known as the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA). FMCSA oversees regulations surrounding commercial motor vehicles (CMVs), such as ready mixed concrete trucks. These regulations include driver's Hours of Service (HOS), Electronic Logging Devices (ELDs), Sleep Apnea, CMV Insurance and Speed Limiters, just to name a few. If you're unclear about what these regulations are or how they'll impact your business, this session will fill in those blanks.			
DEFINING THE ROLE OF THE READY MIXED CONCRETE PRODUCER IN THE CONSTRUCTION PROCESS	The construction process requires teamwork to complete a project. From the acquisition of the materials or components of the desired finished project to the process of assemblage requires rules and conditions which each party involved should fully understand and agree. Assumptions by any party in the process creates grounds for disagreement in the 'field' environment. The ready mixed concrete producer is a supplier of construction materials and as such should consider providing supplier conditions to the recipient of their quote for concrete to ensure there are no 'open' assumptions from which conflict can arise. This presentation will cover model provisions from which a ready mixed concrete. The presentation does in no way suggest that these conditions are absolute or should be used by a ready mixed concrete producer but only for consideration.			
QUALITY CONTROL/ QUALITY ACCEPTANCE (QC/QA) SPECIFICATIONS FOR CONCRETE FLAT-	Over the last couple of decades, QC/QA specifications have been more readily adopted by owners for transportation related projects. The focus of this presentation will define the different types of specifications used by owners, reasons for using QC/QA specifications, pertinent points regarding QC/QA specifications, advantages of QC/QA specifications, and some statistical background to help understand how risk is better balanced between owners and contracting partners when using QC/QA specifications
